W-UM offers four new awards to recognize clubs at DCON

Four new club awards have surfaced in the Wisconsin-Upper Michigan Circle K district. These awards cover a number of bases from service, creativity and travel. There is something for every club within the Capital division and across all of W-UM.

The Preferred Charities Award gives clubs the opportunity to showcase work that they do through service and fundraising, in turn benefiting our preferred charities: March of Dimes, Students Team Up to Fight Hunger (STUFH) and UNICEF. This award mirrors a similar award that can be applied for at the International-level of our organization, so all clubs are encouraged to re-submit their work in order to be recognized internationally as well.

The Club T-Shirt Award challenges clubs to create a T-Shirt design that not promotes Circle K's tenets and emblem, but also channels creativity and club-based originality as well. This award will require clubs to mail in a sample T-Shirt for judging purposes. The winner of this award will have their design being showcased by Governor Morgan Fierro during the dance at DCON. The other submissions will be auctioned off during the dance, benefitting a cause to be

determined at a later date. Once again, this award mirrors a similar award that can be applied for at the International-level of our organization, so all clubs are encouraged to re-submit their work in order to be recognized internationally as well.

The Club Video Award is pilot that we will be running this year. This award will have clubs produce a high-quality video addressing all aspects of Circle K. It is an open-ended project that will also challenge club's creativity. A short essay is required, explaining decisions made by the club's in their filming. The video must be submitted along with this essay in one of the formats expressed on the awards sheet. The winning video will be shown during the closing session of DCON. This award also mirrors a similar award that can be applied for at the International-level of our organization, so all clubs are encouraged to re-submit their work in order to be recognized internationally as well.

The Member Mile Award is an award that recognizing clubs for their attendance at district events throughout the year. This award takes into account the

number of members in attendance and the distanced travelled. A point system in used to evaluate these numbers and clubs will be ranked based on their totals. This award does not recognized attendance at LSSP and ICON, as they are not district events.

The deadline for awards submission is Monday, January 14. Any and all questions regarding awards should be directed to the Awards, Regulations and History Chair, Taryn Grisham.




Winter Escape January 11 – 13 2013
