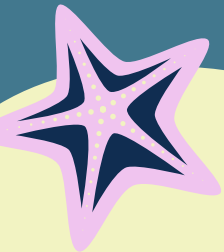

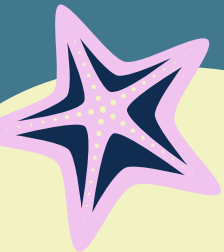
Registration

Map to District Board

Governor

The governor oversees the District board and all club president, as well as appoints committee chairpersons, makes the agendas, and runs District board meetings. They also provide leadership training, attend District events, attend International conferences and events, and visits clubs.

Secretary

The secretary is responsible for all official records and correspondence with the District Board. They work closely with the club secretaries in training them, answering questions about filling out reports, and collecting names and addresses of officers of each club. The secretary attends all board meetings and completes and distributes minutes in a timely manner.

Treasurer

The treasurer is responsible for preparing the operating budget and keeping all appropriate records. They work with the District Administrator to maintain district books and to review and approve vouchers. They also work closely with club treasurers in collecting dues, making budgets, and filling out reports.

Bulletin Editor

The bulletin editor is responsible for the collection of articles, layout, and publication of The Circle of Sharing. They shall send copies of the publication to members of all clubs, the district board, the International Representation, Kiwanis staff, Key Club staff, and others as deemed appropriate.

Lieutenant Governor

Lieutenant governors are responsible for counseling and assist in training all the clubs within their division, as well as working closely with Kiwanians in chartering new clubs and rebuilding inactive clubs. They are also in charge of their divisional trainings and rallies. They inform the clubs of what is going on in the district and within their division.
