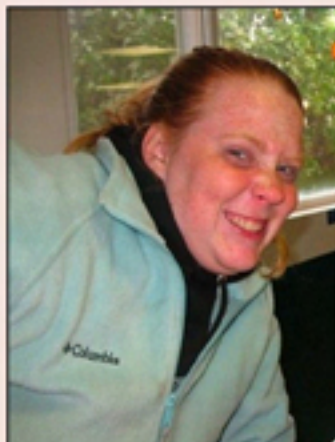

EDGEWOOD COLLEGE REACHES OUT - WAY OUT

RAISING FUNDS FOR HAITIANS IN THEIR TIME OF NEED

There is something going on in the heart of Madison, Wisconsin, and it doesn't involve cheese, the Packers, or snow. It involves raising money for the Haitian people, as they attempt to recover



from the devastating earthquake that occurred earlier this year.

The Circle K club of Edgewood College, the newest club in the Wisconsin-Upper Michigan District has raised over \$600 in the past month for Haiti relief. They have achieved this goal through a multitude of service projects around the Madison area. Their first project involved creating black ribbons and allowing people to donate money for a ribbon.

"This was an easy, but effective project, that really got the word out there in the campus community," says Edgewood College Circle K Charter President Cody Schara. "After completing this project, the campus really got involved with Haiti relief, not only from Circle K, but the entire Edgewood community as a whole." Once "Ribbons for Haiti" was

completed, the group worked for many organizations around Madison, donating their proceeds to Haiti relief. These have involved working for the Wisconsin State Basketball tournament, working for the EPIC Company's community banquet, and more. As a whole, Edgewood College has raised over \$3,000 so far for the Haiti relief. During the month of April, the campus will embark on their next projects for Haiti relief. Circle K will be conducting a hot dog eating contest, entitled 'Hot dogs for Haiti', while the campus effort is planning a big charity cook off for the end of the month. By the end of the school year, the campus hopes to earn \$5,000 for Haiti relief.

Even though Edgewood is W-UM's newest club, it hasn't stopped them from raising as much money as they can. "We know we're new, but we have a really energetic group that is willing to do as much as they can," Schara states. "I'm proud of everything we've done and am honored to give back to the Haitian people."

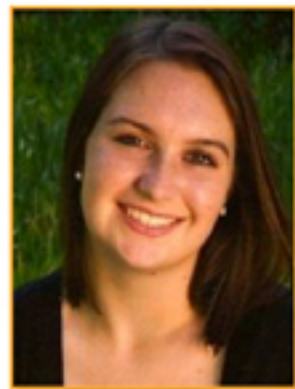
TREASURER KEVIN STAGL

AWARDS, REGULATIONS AND HISTORY CHAIR

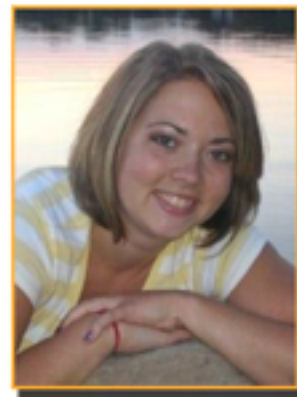

SPECIAL EVENTS CHAIR LYSSA BERGSTROM

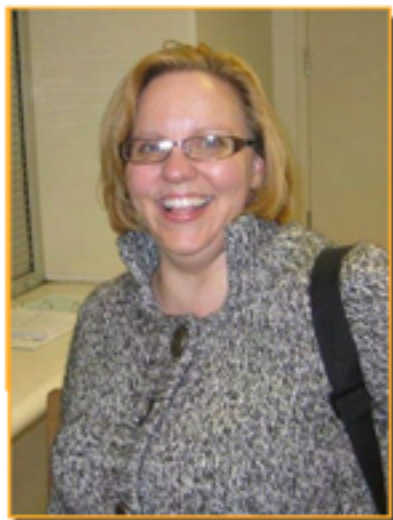

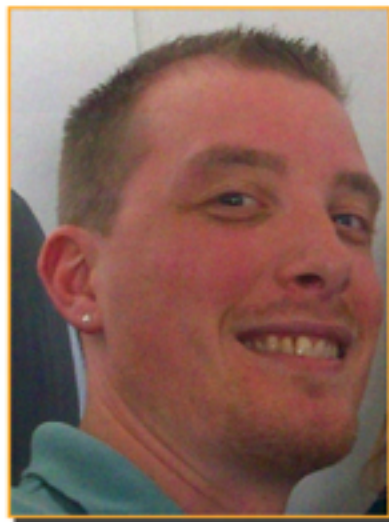
